

Over the course of a full year, interns rotate across specialized departments, each offering unique learning opportunities, hands-on cases, and exposure to different aspects of patient care. This journey allows them to experience dentistry in its full scope, bridging academic knowledge with clinical realities.

External Internship Students at the Faculty of Dentistry – The British University in Egypt

The Faculty of Dentistry at The British University in Egypt takes pride in hosting external internship students as part of its mission to provide an inclusive and enriching educational experience. This program offers interns from other universities the opportunity to benefit from BUE's state-of-the-art clinical facilities, evidence-based teaching, and mentorship from distinguished faculty members.

FIXED PROSTHODONTICS DEPARTMENT



In this rotation, interns work with crowns, bridges, veneers, and other fixed restorations. The experience highlights the art and science of creating long-lasting, aesthetic solutions for patients. Beyond technical skills, interns develop an eye for detail, learning that successful prosthodontics requires harmony between function, health, and appearance.


A 17-year-old girl presented with broken upper central and lateral incisors. On examination, the teeth were endodontically treated with metal posts and cores. No pain on percussion, and the RCT quality was satisfactory.

Treatment Steps:

1. Removal of fractured tooth parts and caries.
2. Removal of old metal posts.
3. Preparation of post space and drilling for fiber posts.
4. Placement and cementation of fiber posts.
5. Core build-up with composite.
6. Tooth preparation for crowns.
7. Digital design using Exocad.
8. Fabrication of PMMA temporaries for try-in.
9. Final restorations delivered after successful fit and esthetic approval.



CONSERVATIVE DENTISTRY DEPARTMENT



Interns strengthen their foundation in conservative dentistry department , focusing on cavity preparation, restorative materials, and root canal treatments. The department emphasizes precision, accuracy, and the importance of preserving natural tooth structure. For many, this rotation is the perfect opportunity to refine the skills they first learned in the simulation lab and apply them with confidence in a clinical setting.

A 17-year-old patient presented to the dental clinic expressing esthetic concerns and embarrassment about her smile. Clinical examination revealed a severe case of Molar-Incisor Hypomineralization (MIH) affecting the quality of both enamel and dentin. The enamel surfaces appeared pitted and porous, exposing areas of underlying dentin.

Treatment provided included:

Direct composite veneers on the upper six anterior teeth, aiming to restore esthetics, improve surface integrity, and protect the affected enamel and dentin.

The treatment significantly enhanced the patient's smile esthetics and confidence, providing a more natural and uniform appearance.







ORAL AND MAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY DEPARTMENT







The round aims to enhance the interns' understanding of periodontal health and its importance in maintaining overall oral health, while also improving their manual dexterity and confidence in clinical practice.




These lectures aimed to enhance students' clinical knowledge and strengthen their understanding of key pediatric dentistry concepts that are essential for the exam.








ENDODONTICS DEPARTMENT








A patient presented to the clinic seeking full mouth rehabilitation for both the upper and lower arches due to extensive tooth wear and compromised esthetics. After thorough clinical and radiographic evaluation, the treatment plan involved restoring the anterior teeth with full ceramic crowns to achieve optimal esthetics and translucency, while the posterior teeth were planned to be restored with zirconia crowns for enhanced strength and durability. This comprehensive approach aimed to restore proper function, occlusion, and an improved smile appearance, ensuring both long-term stability and patient satisfaction.




Dental Photography

By integrating oral health awareness with stress management, the initiative reinforced the idea that true well-being lies in the harmony between body, mind, and smile.




Inspiring Leadership: Internship Students Attend the 6th Women Summit with Prof. Hala Zakaria
