British University in Egypt Dental Implantology Certificate

Aims and Objectives

Aims:

-The course aims to provide the dental graduates who have completed the introductory level of dental implantology further comprehensive knowledge and direct one to one clinical experience of basic principles of oral surgery as well as further one to one direct clinical experience of dental and oral Implantology. This is to be provided jointly by the British University in Egypt and the Oral Surgery Team of the University of Sheffield from the United Kingdom.

Candidates would be graduate dentists that will be expected to have had a very basic knowledge of dental implantology and completed intern year of dentistry in Egypt and have full dental licence and hold the right to practice dentistry in Egypt or their relevant country.

At successful completion of the degree, delegates will be expected to possess competent level of clinical skills and ability to provide simple and moderate complexity level of clinical dental implantology and have knowledge of complex dental implantology and knowledge of advanced bone grafting procedures.

The Course structure is based on a combination of lectures, clinical teaching and knowledge acquired via evidence-based research.



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Aims and Objectives

Objectives:

-Deliver the theoretical experience via providing multiple online based educational modules and lectures to cover the basic and advanced knowledge of oral surgery as well as oral and dental implantology.

Practical experiences; delegate students would be expected to have completed 10 to 8 dental implant cases during their courses; this includes planning, surgical placement, and restoration of the complete case during the course. Successful delegates would be expected to have completed at minimum of five cases at the competent level.

During the course; the delegates would be expected to complete an evidence-based research project and as part of their final assessment of the course completion they would be expected to provide a presentation on the complete cases performed or at least one complete case/s to cover the treatment process and treatment justification



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Aims and Objectives

Course Structure:

The course is aimed at the graduate dentist, and it is expected that most clinicians at that career stage may have other clinical commitments, hence the course is based on 3 days a week commitment. The course will run over the period of 12 month with delegates update in March of the relevant year, and course completion at the following march, due to the clinical nature of the course, it would be expected that some clinical case completion of the treatment may be extended, and course extensions would be considered on individual basis each case on its own merits, with possible extension to a maximum of further 3 months.

The course is modular and based on three modules, the first module will cover theoretical and academic based knowledge of the basic dental implantology and surgical set up with surgical and restorative basics of dental implantology, this is to cover basic knowledge, clinical case evaluation and assessment, as well as surgical and restorative stages of dental implant treatments as well as long term maintenance.

The second module is based on theoretical and academic knowledge of advanced clinical implantology, advanced bone grafting as well as advanced restorative management of clinical dental implantology. The third module will be based on evidence-based research and delegates will be expected to complete an academic evidence-based project in subjects of clinical dental implantology.

Concurrently, throughout the course duration, delegates will be expected to undertake multiple practical sessions in the lab and in clinical environment where they will get exposure, gain the clinical experience, and complete their clinical case requirements under direct clinical supervision from qualified specialist surgeons and specialist prosthodontists.

The practical sessions and clinical experience will be provided at the clinical facilities at the British University of Egypt campus.

Finally, delegates will be expected to undergo assessment and complete evaluation excises throughout the whole course duration. This will be via the different assessment tools provided at course enrolment, as well as during the clinical sessions and towards the end of the course with clinical case presentations, as final course completion
