







Typical Intern Activities:

- Learn The Importance of patient examinations and treatment planning Procedures.
- Practicing the placement of various direct restorative materials like composite, and glass ionomer fillings.
- Performing indirect restorations like inlays, onlays, and crowns.
- Learning and Perform the Complex dental impression taking techniques , model fabrication, and laboratory communication.
- Participating in discussions about material selection, cavity preparation, and restoration design.


Key Skills for Interns:

The endodontics department is focused on the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the dental pulp and periradicular tissues.

- It is typically a specialized clinical area within a dental school or teaching hospital.

Intern Involvement in Endodontics Rounds:

- Endodontics rounds usually occur 2-3 times per week and last around 5 hours.
- During the rounds, interns will Perform an Work On Patient seeking endodontics treatment .

Typical Activities and Learning Experiences:

- Observing comprehensive endodontic examinations, including pulp testing and radiographic analysis.
- Perform and demonstrate various of endodontic procedures, such as:
 - Root canal treatment (primary and retreatment cases)
 - Vital pulp therapy (pulp capping, pulpotomy)
 - Surgical endodontics (apicoectomy, retrograde filling)
- Participating in discussions about treatment planning, case selection, and procedural techniques.

Learning Objectives:

- Develop a sound understanding of the biological basis of endodontic disease and its management.
- Gain exposure to a variety of endodontic presentations and treatment approaches.
- Practice critical thinking and decision-making skills in endodontic case management.
- Learn proper techniques for safe and effective endodontic procedures.
- Appreciate the role of the general dentist in providing primary endodontic care.

5. Feedback and Assessment:

- The supervising faculty will provide regular feedback to the interns on their participation, knowledge, and clinical skills.
- Interns may be assigned additional reading, case studies, or hands-on exercises to reinforce their learning.
- Periodic written or practical examinations may be used to assess the interns' progress and competency in endodontics.






THE FIXED PROSTHETICS DEPARTMENT TEAM

The fixed prosthetics department focuses on the restoration and replacement of missing or damaged teeth using fixed dental prostheses, such as crowns, bridges, and inlays/onlays.

- It is a specialized clinical area within the BUE Faculty of Dentistry.

Intern Involvement in Fixed Prosthetics Rounds:

- Fixed prosthetics rounds typically occur 1-3 times per week and last approximately 2-5 hours.
- During the rounds, a group of dental interns will accompany an experienced fixed prosthetics faculty member or resident.
- The group will rotate through the fixed prosthetics treatment procedures and observe various cases.

Typical Activities and Learning Experiences:

- Performing patient examinations, treatment planning, and clinical decision-making processes for fixed prosthetic treatments.
 - perform various fixed prosthetic procedures, such as:
 - Tooth preparation for crowns and bridges
 - Impression taking and model fabrication
 - Provisional restoration placement
 - Cementation of final restorations
 - Participating in discussions about material selection, design considerations, and laboratory communication.
 - Learning about the use of specialized fixed prosthetic instruments and equipment.

Learning Objectives:

- Develop a comprehensive understanding of the principles and techniques of fixed prosthodontics.
- Gain exposure to a variety of fixed prosthetic treatment scenarios and outcomes.
- Practice critical thinking and decision-making skills in fixed prosthetic case management.
- Learn proper techniques for safe and effective fixed prosthetic procedures.
- Appreciate the role of the general dentist in providing primary fixed prosthetic care.

Feedback and Assessment:

- The supervising faculty will provide regular feedback to the interns on their participation, knowledge, and clinical skills.
 - Interns may be assigned additional reading, case studies, or hands-on exercises to reinforce their learning.
 - Periodic written or practical examinations may be used to assess the interns' progress and competency in fixed prosthodontics.

The Removable Prosthetics Department is part of the dental program at the British University in Egypt. It focuses on training students in the design, fabrication, and fitting of removable dental prosthetics.

As an internship program, it provides hands-on clinical experience for dental students, allowing them to work directly with patients under the supervision of experienced dentists and prosthodontists.

The internship program likely covers topics such as:

Partial and complete denture design and construction

Reline and repair of existing dentures



Implant-retained and tooth-supported prosthetics

Jaw registration and bite evaluation

Shade selection and esthetics for removable prosthetics

- Students get experience taking impressions, creating models, and fabricating custom removable dentures and partials in the university's dental labs and clinics.

- The internship helps prepare students for careers as general dentists or specialist working with removable dental prosthetics.

1. Periodontics clinic rounds for Internship students typically occur 1-3 times per week and last from 2-5 hours.

- The rounds involve a group of working internship students, supervised by a periodontics faculty member or resident.

2. Intern Participation:

- During the rounds, interns will have the opportunity to:

- Practice comprehensive periodontal examinations, including probing, charting, and radiograph analysis.

- perform non-surgical treatments like scaling, root planing, and application of antimicrobial agents.

- Observe and Perform surgical procedures such as gingivectomies, flap surgeries, and dental implant placements.

- Interns may be asked to assist the faculty/resident with certain tasks, depending on their skill level and comfort.

- There will be time for questions and discussions about the cases and treatment approaches.

3. Learning Objectives:

- Develop a deeper understanding of the clinical decision-making process in periodontal therapy.

- Gain exposure to a wide range of periodontal conditions and the corresponding treatment modalities.

- Practice critical thinking skills by analyzing patient presentations and proposed treatment plans.

- Learn effective communication techniques for educating patients about their periodontal health.

- Appreciate the importance of a multidisciplinary approach in comprehensive dental care.


4. Feedback and Assessment:

The OMF department round is a clinical round where interns and residents learn to evaluate and manage patients with complex oral and maxillofacial cases under the supervision of experienced faculty members.

Pre-Round Preparation:

- 1. Review relevant anatomy and pathology:** Brush up on your knowledge of oral and maxillofacial anatomy, including the hard and soft tissues of the face, skull, and oral cavity.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with common OMF conditions:** Study common conditions seen in OMF practice, such as facial trauma, oral cancer, cleft lip and palate, temporomandibular joint disorders, and orthognathic surgery.
- 3. Understand treatment options:** Learn about various treatment options for OMF conditions, including surgical and non-surgical approaches.
- 4. Review radiology:** Familiarize yourself with common radiological findings in OMF patients, including CT scans, MRI, and radiographs.

Benefits of OMF Department Rounds for Internship Students:

- 1. Practical experience:** Gain hands-on experience in evaluating and managing patients with complex OMF cases.

- During the internship, students work directly with child patients under the supervision of experienced pediatric dentists. They get experience in areas such as:


- Preventive dental care for children**

Clear Aligner Workshop

Multidisciplinary Management of Grossly Decayed Lower Anterior Teeth: A Case Report

(Case managed during Internship Comprehensive Rounds: June – August 2023)

- Grossly decayed or mutilated tooth refers to a condition in which a tooth is severely decayed to the extent that the amount of tooth structure lost is greater than the amount remaining.
- This leads to discomfort, pain, and loss of function — in addition to a handful of other concerns for the patient.
- However, this issue is further complicated when the teeth in question are anterior teeth as esthetic demands become the main concern.
- Treatment of such cases often requires multidisciplinary dental care which involves segmenting the treatment plan into distinct "stages" and a prolonged maintenance and follow-up phase.

Case Summary: A 25-year-old female patient arrived at the BUE comprehensive dental clinic on the 9th of June, 2023.

Chief Complaint: Unappealing smile.

Treatment Plan: Scaling & Polishing → RCT → Functional Crown Lengthening → Crowns.

Finally, the patient was placed on a strict oral hygiene regimen with frequent follow ups at regular intervals.

This case highlights the importance of careful treatment planning as well as well-orchestrated multidisciplinary dental treatment.

CASE SUMMARY

A 26-year-old systemically fit female patient presented to the clinic with a chief complaint of dissatisfaction with her smile in addition to missing and badly decayed teeth.


Fig. 6.0 2 PFM crowns were done for upper left 2nd premolar and 1st molar


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
