#### About the Programme

The Economics programme has two central activities: first, to train students at the undergraduate level in the methods and ideas of modern economics; second, to conduct both basic and applied research in Economics that pushes forward the frontier of knowledge in the field.

The programme is distinctive in that it is one of the very few in Egypt fully consistent with the requirements of a **Bachelor of Science** degree, with a strong emphasis on analytical approaches to economic problems using mathematics, statistics, econometrics, and modelling. Students are offered a Research Methods module to prepare them for their Honours Dissertation, and they can focus on one or more thematic concentrations, enhancing employability and readiness for postgraduate study or research careers.

### Progression Requirements

- The programme is structured over four years, with 120 credits per year.
- Modules vary between 10, 20, and 30 credits. One credit equals roughly 10 hours of student effort.
- Students must pass the required credits each year in line with university regulations to progress.
