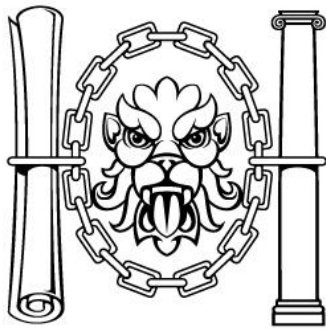

The Chartered Institute of Architectural Technologists (CIAT) is a dynamic, forward-thinking and inclusive global membership qualifying body for Architectural Technology.

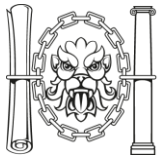
It represents those practicing and studying within the discipline and profession. It is a membership organization representing 10,000 members within the discipline who wish to be professionally recognized.

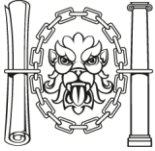
Thank you for your recent submission for Accreditation in Principle of the BSc (Hons) Architectural Design and Technology Programme.
